Convention of Biological Diversity

We have forwarded the petition to the Convention of Biological Diversity (CBD) to be used in the negotiations for the next COP15 (Conference Of the Parties) meeting about global biodiversity, hosted in the 3th quarter of 2022 in China. The CBD recently organized a preparation meeting in Geneva to negotiate the input for this next COP15 meeting. What can you do to help!

To influence the next COP15 negotiations and to make sure that freshwater migratory fish, river connectivity and free flowing rivers will become a top global priority we ask you to contact your national CBD contact person. - A WhatsApp group has also been created to interact directly among the J-AIL, to warn, ask or answer questions about grants, awards, positions, funding options, stays, etc. And also, to meet more frequently. Soon the information to join the group will be sent.
- → A single document (shared with google sheet or slack) will be created with a list of all pre/postdoc grants.
- → An AlL-network is pretended to be created to increase the activity between Portugal and Spain. Ideas about how to reinforce this network (e.g., by creating grants for stays in the AlL-network centre) to reinforce it are arisen.
- A **Monitoring club** is pretended to be created. There, early careers will have a "godmother / godfather" or a tutor out of the official academic life, that could help them with analysis, mentoring, motivation...
- → Organize working groups or commissions with volunteers, to carry out the different activities developed by the J-AIL (intermeeting course and workshops, monitoring group, feedbacks...).
